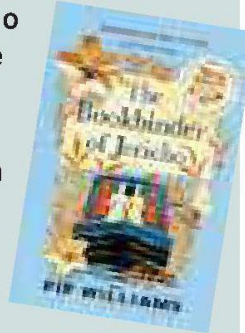


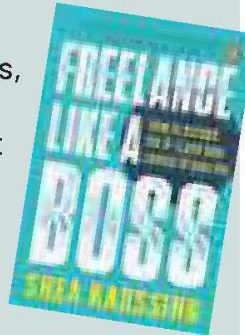
Books in brief
